- I. <u>Sow Wisely</u> (vv. 7-8)
 - A. Sow as if God were the audience (v. 7).

 - C. Sow as if you believed in consequences.
- II. <u>Sow Widely</u> (vv. 9-10)
 - A. Sow without fainting (v. 9).
 - B. Do Good unto all (v. 10).
 - C. Do good especially *to them who are of the household of faith* (v. 10).

- 2. Can unbelievers expect much help from God in those times? Why can we believers expect more? Is that your normal initial expectation?
- 3. As you read v. 7, do you connect well with the farming idea of "sowing and reaping"?
- 4. What does it mean when we are told that "God is not mocked"? And how is *deception* involved here?
- 5. According to v. 8, how different is the first part from the second part? Where do you fit today?
- 6. What is "corruption" vs. "everlasting life"? Do you see this as a stark difference or a similarity?
- 7. In v. 9, we are told not to *grow weary* nor *lose heart*. Why might that be the tendency when *doing good*? Who might be against us?
- 8. So, what can you believe and do differently next time you feel weary?
- 9. According to v. 10, who are the two people groups that we are to "do good works" toward?
- 10. How are we to maintain the priority in our good deeds? Is there someone in our church today that you could be a blessing to by going to them with an offer to take care of something you know they need?
